


A Product of Alcohol Monitoring System (AMS)

DRUG URINALYSIS

Detection of drugs through urine test

Detectable drugs

Cocaine

Opiates

Amphetamines

Marijuana

Oxycodone

PCP

Antidepressants

Ecstacy



DRUG PATCH

Detection of drugs through sweat.

Patch lasts for 7-10 days.

Drugs detected from 1-2 days before patch applied and up to 24 hours prior to removal.

Cocaine

Opiates

Amphetamines

Marijuana

PBT STATS

February 1, 2005 – April 1, 2012

- 21,589 participants (active and completed)
- 4.7 million tests
- 4.65 million (99.27%) passed tests
- 15,645 tests failed
- 18,816 No Show

NUMBER OF FAILED TESTS

- > 55% never fail a test
- > 16.7% fail only one test
- > 12.5% fail only twice
- > 16.9% fail three or more times

SCRAM STATS

November 10, 2006 – April 4, 2012

- 4,073 Participants
- 588,861 days for an average of 145 days per participant
- 100% complaint- 77%
- Non-complaint- 23%

September 16, 2009 the SD Supreme Court upheld its use (State v. Lemler 2009 SD 86)






Rearrest rates of 24/7 program participants compared to non participants for 2nd offense DUIs (Mountain Plains Evaluation, LLC)

24/7 Program – Recidivism Analysis

 Compared to non 24/7 participants, arrest to arrest (next DUI offense) recidivism is substantially lower for 24/7 participants at 1, 2 and 3 years.

 Even lower rates are documented for individuals that have 30 and 90 days of consecutive twice a day testing on the program.

PROGRAM FEES

PBT

Cost = \$.10 per PBT tube + staff time.

\$1 – To AG (1st 30 days – Participation Fee).

<u>UA</u>

\$10.00 per test – Remains with testing agency.

Drug Patch

\$40.00 per patch – Remains with testing agency. Agency pays testing cost from fee.

PROGRAM FEES

SCRAM Fees:

- \$40.00 Activation Fee Paid to and remains with testing agency.
- \$40.00 Deactivation Fee Paid to and remains with testing agency.
- \$6.00 Daily monitoring fee:
 - \$3.80 to Alcohol Monitoring Systems (AMS).
 - \$1.00 returned to testing agency (based on collections).
 - \$1.20 to AG's Office to operate program.

Includes \$30.00 monthly Participation Fee paid to the State.

▶ 60 Day Inspection: \$20.00
