



CIVIL DIVISION

- Civil Cases in State or Federal Court: 35
- Administrative Cases: 88
- Legal Advice to at least 16 State Agencies and 20 Boards and Commissions
 - For example, the Division provides legal work for the Board of Water and Natural Resources
 - Assisted with over 137 loans or grants for water projects, which totaled \$415.4 million
 - Provided legal work for South Dakota Conservancy District bonds totaling over \$156.6 million
- Backup for Criminal and Appellate Cases

CIVIL DIVISION

Meta

- The federal complaint was filed in the US District Court for the Northern District of California in the Fall of 2023.
- The federal complaint alleges that Meta knew of the harmful impacts its platforms had on the mental health of young people and that the company misled the public about the harms associated with the use of its platforms.
- TikTok is under review and consideration.

CIVIL DIVISION

Pharmaceuticals

- On March 14, 2018, first filed suit in South Dakota v. Purdue Pharma alleging several opioid manufacturers knowingly distributed false information to increase the sales of opioid drugs.
- Total anticipated settlements of approximately \$78.6 million
 - McKesson Corp, Cardinal Health, Inc, AmerisourceBergen Corp, and Janssen: \$50 million over 15 years
 - Walgreens, CVS, Walmart, Teva & Allergan payments anticipated starting in 2024: \$28.6 million
- The settlement funds go into the opioid abatement and remediation fund under SDCL 34-20B-116.

As of July 2023, over \$596 million has been received from the 1998 Tobacco Master Settlement Agreement



TOP COMPLAINT CATEGORIES FOR FY2023

- Foreign Fraud grandparent, sweepstakes, romance, shipping scams, etc
- Auto repairs, warranty, repossession, titles, used & new purchase issues
- Landlord/Tenant deposit, eviction, repair, lease
- Internet retail, websites, phishing, streaming, fraud

CRIMINAL DIVISION

State v. Lange

- On November 9, 2021, a man entered a home in Scotland, SD and shot each person (including a 5-year-old child) in the home at least 2 times.
- Francis Lange was convicted on 3 counts of First-Degree
 Murder and 2 counts of Aggravated Assault.
- Lange was sentenced to 3 consecutive life sentences plus 30 years.

State v. Monroe and Jones

- Inmates Lester Monroe and Kyle Jones are alleged to have brutally assaulted a guard at the State prison.
- Monroe and Jones are charged with Attempted First-Degree Murder, Aggravated Assault on a Law Enforcement Officer and Simple Assault on a Law Enforcement Officer.
- Monroe and Jones are presumed innocent until such time as proven guilty

MEDICAID FRAUD CONTROL UNIT (MFCU)

- MFCU investigates Medicaid provider fraud, abuse and neglect of patients, financial exploitation of patients, and drug diversion cases
- Cases Opened: 33
- Incidents and Reports Reviewed: 835
- Total Restitution and Recoveries: \$389,599
- Federal Fiscal Year 2024 Budget:
 - \$205K State Funds
 - \$615K Federal Funds

MEDICAID FRAUD CONTROL UNIT (MFCU)


Dr. Erin Hower

- Dr. Erin Hower's medical license was indefinitely suspended in the State of North Carolina.
- Dr. Hower came to SD and obtained employment as a physician.
- Dr. Hower failed to disclose that her medical license had been suspended.
- MFCU recouped \$37,200 that Dr. Hower billed to the SD Medicaid program while her medical license was suspended.
- Criminal charges are pending against Dr. Hower for making false statements.



Piper Case


- Death-row inmate Briley Piper stabbed and beat Chester Allan Poage to death in 2000.
- Piper is South Dakota's sole death row inmate.
- Piper continues to fight his jury sentence in federal court.

David Lee Case

- David Lee was convicted of second-degree murder and was sentenced to life in prison.
- Lee attempted to get his conviction overturned but he did not file a motion within the statutory time frame.
- A Minnehaha County court said Lee could still collaterally attack his conviction despite the default.
- The South Dakota Supreme Court disagreed, keeping the murder conviction and sentence in place.






- FY2023 federal funding: \$394,867
 - No significant or sustained increase in the last five years
 - Forensic software and license renewals have increased by 100% in the last five years
 - Cost of forensic software and license renewals for existing forensic software in FY2024: \$211,200
- 190% increase in the number of CyberTips over the last five years
- A total of 2,850 items of digital evidence were examined in 2023

OFFICER INVOLVED SHOOTINGS

- In 2023 there were 7 Officer Involved Shootings
 - Sioux Falls 1
 - Rapid City 3
 - Highway Patrol 2
 - Huron PD 1
- Injuries to the offender(s) by officers occurred in 7 of the shootings
- 4 of the offenders were on parole or probation at the time of the incident
- The Attorney General's Office has issued opinions in 7 of the incidents – all 7 incidents have been found to be justified shootings

- Since 2010 there have been 67 officer involved shooting incidents
 - 35 subject fatalities
 - 2 officer fatalities
 - 2 officers with life threatening injuries
 - Offenders have tested positive for drugs and/or alcohol in 60 of the Officer Involved Shooting incidents (4 tested negative, 3 unknown)
 - Offenders have made suicidal statements, attempts and/or had a reported mental illness in 50 incidents (3 shot themselves during incident)



COMBINED DNA INDEX SYSTEM (CODIS) HITS - CASE EXAMPLE

- May 2023 in Sioux Falls, SD, one male subject picked up a female, drove her to a parking lot where he physically and sexually assaulted her outside of the vehicle and then drove off. The following week a similar sexual assault occurred, a male subject picked up a female, drove her to a secluded outdoor location and again physically and sexually assaulted her and drove off.
- The victims were able to describe a similar make, model and color vehicle used by the suspect in both cases. The vehicle information was sent to the Fusion Center where a hit occurred in Madison, SD on a vehicle matching the description from the victims.
- Law Enforcement collected a stain from the sidewalk in the area where the first assault had occurred and had collected the clothing from the second victim that claimed the suspect had forcibly removed her clothing.
- A CODIS hit occurred between the DNA profile obtained from the stain on the sidewalk and the pant leg of the second victim.
- The suspect was located and apprehended in Huron, SD. He had access to a vehicle similar to the ones described by the victims and had no known connection to either victim.

CODIS HIT LOCATIONS




STATEWIDE AUTOMATED VICTIM INFORMATION & NOTIFICATION (SAVIN)




FY2025 ONGOING BUDGET REQUEST SALARY PACKAGE



SOUTH DAKOTA FORENSIC LAB - FIREARMS



- Based on the last 5 years there is, on average, a 10% increase in firearms assignments each year. Projected assignments for 2024 would be 328 and for 2025 would be 361.
- Once hired, an untrained firearms analyst will need to complete an 18-24 month training before they can begin firearms caseworks. The earliest a new analyst could begin casework would be January 2026.
- Under current projections, the lab will receive 397 firearms assignments in 2026. This would be 132 completed assignments each for three examiners.
