Performance Requirements

This is a timed qualification (see COF sheet for time limits.) Shots fired over the time limit must be deducted from the final score. The holster and magazine pouches must be snapped/secured at all times. The shooter is to start the sequence in an interview stance, with their hands in front and above their waist. The shooter is responsible for keeping the firearm loaded and must shoot only designated number of rounds. Any extra rounds fired must be deducted from the score. Alibi shots are not allowed and any unfired rounds must be turned in at the end of the COF. Time standards should be controlled by a shot timer or a turning target system.

Target scoring

The target for the COF must contain a B21 shape scoring area. The B21 scoring area consists of a bottle shape within the torso, neck, and head. Hits in the scoring area of the target count as 1 hit each. Hits on the white/subdued line around the scoring area count as a hit. No other hits are counted. The actual bullet hole must be on or inside the white line for it to be counted. State qualification requires a minimum score of 38 to pass.

Equipment Required

50 rounds, eye/ear protection, a baseball cap, and holstered & secured handgun.

Optional Lateral movements (left or right) are permitted during the course of fire.
